ASSEMBLY MEMBER FRAZIER TO PRESENT EAST CONTRA COSTA FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT WITH \$500,000 IN ADDITIONAL FUNDING

April 20, 2021 – ASSEMBLY MEMBER FRAZIER TO PRESENT EAST CONTRA COSTA
FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT WITH \$500,000 IN ADDITIONAL FUNDING

After fighting delays and setbacks due to COVID-19, Assembly Member Jim Frazier was able to acquire \$500,000 in additional funding for the East Contra Costa Fire Protection District that will be used to build a much-needed mobile fire unit training tower.

WHAT: This Friday, April 23, Assembly Member Frazier will be presenting the Board Members of the East Contra Costa Fire Protection District with a check for half of a million dollars to be used for building a training tower for their firefighters.

Participants will meet in front of Station 53 in Oakley at 11 AM.

WHO: Assembly Member Frazier, President and Vice President of the East Contra Costa Fire Protection District, Fire Chief, the Fire Marshal, and Sparky.

WHY: Funding for the ECCFPD was first established when the district was primarily rural and has not evolved as the East County population has grown. The property tax allocation share has stayed at 7% of the total county funds, while the need for services has increased dramatically as more people have moved to the area.
