Community Project Funding – Federal Appropriations Process	Fire Station	\$3 million	<p>Project was submitted to Congressman McNerney on April 19 and selected as one of the Congressman’s top projects to be submitted to the House Appropriations Committee for consideration. The project was included for \$1,500,000 in the Six-Bill Appropriations Minibus that passed the House on July 31.</p> <p>Congress is currently operating under a Continuing Resolution (CR) that expires February 18, 2022. Until a final FY 22 budget agreement is met, Community Project Funding will not be final.</p>

The Foundation focuses its resources in areas served by Firehouse Subs restaurants (within a 60-mile radius).
